- The teacher must provide an understanding of the ongoing learning objectives clearly and if students have shown success, the teacher needs to provide adequate feedback.

English education at kindergarten level is synonymous with teaching a baby the mother tongue. In general, children at school do not know English yet, so this will have an impact on the pattern of teaching English at kindergarten level which is more introductory.
